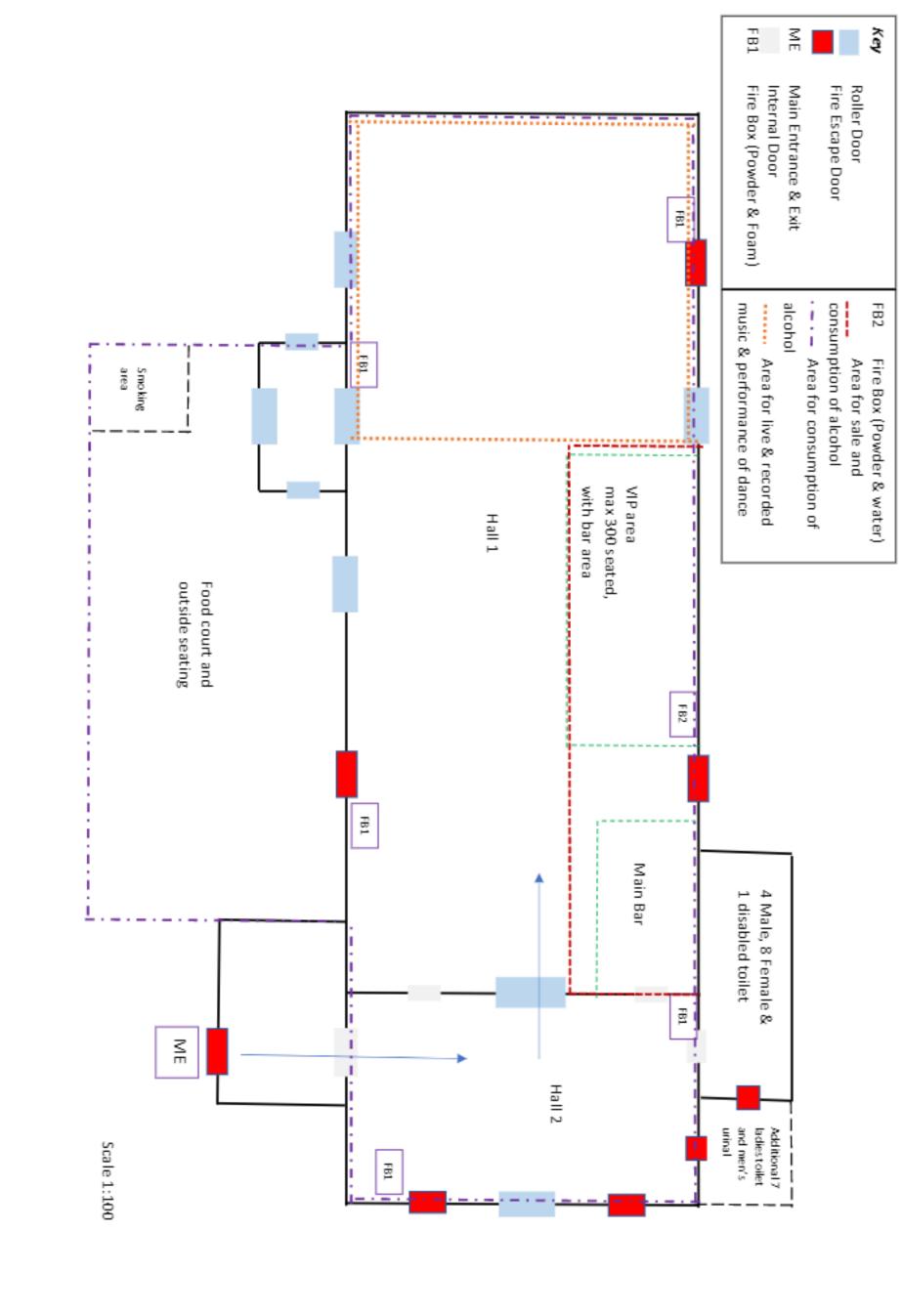
Home Office online right to work checking service

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their 9-digit share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work) which, along with the applicant's date of birth (provided within this application), will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Appendix B-E: The four licensing objectives.

General Summary:

101 Entertainment Ltd – T/A "Flamingo Bingo" intend to hold a number of entertainment events featuring Bingo and Dance over the next twelve months at Carew Airfield Business Park, Carew, SA70 8SX. The events will be assessed and an Event Safety Management Plan formed.

The maximum occupancy figure for the venue has been assessed to be of 2,640. Our intention is circa 1500 occupancy. If the demand is there we may increase slightly but this would be under the control of a clicker. *Please note events also have a 10-15% non-attendance rate*.

The events will open from 18:00hrs until finish at 13:00hrs.

The events will be over eighteens only.

There will be employed SIA registered doorman for each event, first aiders and a fire safety officer. There is also an Event Safety Specialist consulted.



There will be a sub-contracted catering outlet outside the main building. The stage and sound is also sub-contracted. There will be celebrity appearances.

Appendix B: Licensing Objectives

The prevention of crime and disorder (1)

Registered SIA Door Supervisors will be working the events to ensure safety and control for the evenings.

The correct amount of Door Supervisors will be employed for the volume of people attending.

During the events all staff will challenge anti-social behaviour. Bar staff will refuse to serve attendees who have consumed too much alcohol. Sensible drinking will be encouraged. Random bag searches will take place.

Drug use will be looked for and persons asked to leave if suspected of drug use.

CCTV is installed at the venue to cover the outside of the building to monitor activity.

The whole external area and car park will be well lit with permanent lighting.

SIA staff will be placed in the car park to ensure attendees are supervised on arrival and departure and that behaviours are monitored.



We will be working with a private bus company to limit congestion on the main road and surrounding areas also at the end of the events to ensure the safe exit of members of the public.

Appendix C

Public Safety (2)

To ensure the safety of the public at our events we will have registered SIA doorman (2 for the first 100 then an additional 1 for every 100 after). We will use a clicker system so we know the occupancy inside the building at any one time.

The maximum number of persons permitted to use the licensed premises at any one time will not exceed 2000. Any re-admission will be via hand stamp.

The events open early to avoid large crowds and queuing

All exits and routes will be kept clear and available throughout the duration of the events. Fire exit doors will be kept clear from any obstruction.

There will be no naked flames at the events or internal fuel storage and a Fire Risk Assessment will be done. There are no pyrotechnics only low risk fog machines and a hazer.

There will be a designated smoking area outside of the building.



A separate parking area behind the main building for emergency vehicles close to the main building will be designated. Access for emergency vehicles from the designated parking location will be kept clear and free from obstruction at all times.

There will be a strictly no standing on chairs or tables policy with signs clearly on show forbidding this. Anyone not complying will be asked to leave the premises immediately.

There will be no customers allowed on stage throughout the events. The stage will be manned by SIA doormen.

Sufficiently trained staff will be on duty and a safety briefing will be carried out with all staff and door persons prior to the event start times. During this briefing a code word will be denounced so in the event of a fire or emergency to evacuate the building everyone will know the code word to get the attendees out without alarming them and causing panic. All staff will be made aware of the efficient running of the premises and the safe evacuation of the premises during this briefing.

The duty fire safety officer will be responsible for fire prevention measures, marshalling with others and for ensuring that all escape routes including exit doors are fully available.



The stage sound and lighting is provided by "Sound Hire Wales" and have their own risk assessment and public liability insurance which we have viewed.

The fire service shall be called if there is any suspected outbreak of fire.

We will have adequate first aiders suitable for the number of guests attending the event. There will be adequate toilet facilities for male and females and also one disabled toilet.

Car and bus parking areas will be clearly signposted to ensure all members of the public are safe when arriving and leaving the premises. The car park and surrounding areas are well lit at night time.

Please note: All public liability documents and health and safety assessments inclusive of an event safety plan, risk assessments, fire safety plan, staff briefs will be kept on site throughout the event. These will also be shared with all Responsible Authorities prior to the event.



Appendix D

The prevention of public nuisance (3)

There will be a sound engineer at all times controlling noise levels minimising noise pollution. The noise levels have been assessed and will be compliant.

In the event of a noise complaint on the evening the engineer can rectify immediately to solve any issues. Noise monitoring will be carried out before and during the event.

SIA staff will verbally encourage attendees to leave the site quietly inclusive of noise from their vehicle as well as self being mindful of neighbouring residents. We will erect signs at the site asking this of attendees.

An adequate number of bins for use of customers shall be provided in the main building and also in the vicinity of the catering outlet.

The bins shall be emptied frequently to prevent build up. Signs shall be displayed at the main exit requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and area quietly.

There will be no tipping of glass bottles into other vessels that may create noise during the night hours.



Lights will be turned off as soon as reasonably practicable after the event.

Appendix E

The protection of children from harm (4)

It is an over eighteens event where a double identification check will be in place. No staff employed will be under 18.

A lot of bookings will be done online where they will be advised that ID is required upon entry if adequate ID is not shown then entry will be refused.

No person under the age of eighteen will be allowed at the event (this is advertised clearly on social media).

A registered SIA doorperson will be at the entrance checking identification and that the person is over eighteen.

If there is any doubt we will ask for two forms of ID.

If no identification is produced then they will be refused entry. This is also advertised on social media.

ID checks will also be done by bar staff again if no identification is at hand then the SIA doorperson will ask the person to leave immediately.

We have strict policy in place that everybody must bring identification.
